JAZZ CHORDS WORKSHEET: BASIC SCALES 2

LISTED BELOW IS A SERIES OF CHORDS (NOT INTENDED TO BE PLAYED AS A PROGRESSION). REMEMBER, THE BASIC JAZZ SCALES ARE MAJOR (♭⁰=MAJ⁰), MINOR-MAJOR (♭⁰=M⁰. I.E.L. MIN⁰), MIXOLYDIAN (♭⁰=M⁰), DORIAN (♭⁰), LOCRIAN OR HALF-DIMINISHED (♭⁰), AND DIMINISHED (♭⁰).

WRITE THE SCALE THAT WOULD MOST COMMONLY BE USED TO IMPROVISE OVER EACH CHORD. USE ACCIDENTALS, NOT KEY SIGNATURES. THEN, WRITE THE NAME OF THE SCALE/CHORD UNDERNEATH EACH CHORD. FINALLY, CIRCLE THE MAIN CHORD NOTES (ROOT, THIRD, FIFTH, AND SEVENTH).
