

### Practicing Simple Sentences

<b>Subject + Verb + Object + Prepositional Phrase = Simple Sentence</b>

The above formula may seem simplistic; indeed, it would be wrong to assume that all writing fits this pattern. However, the formula does provide a good foundation for the simple sentence. When you find yourself struggling to edit a sentence you have written that has grown unwieldy, paring it down to these component parts can help you gain control of the sentence and its central idea.
