EVERY DAY	NOW	YESTERDAY
1. He is here every day	He <u> IS </u> here now.	He <u> WAS </u> here yesterday.
2. I <u> THINK </u> about you every day.	I 'm thinking about you now.	I <u> THOUGHT </u> about you yesterday.
3. We play tennis every day.	We <u> ARE PLAYING </u> tennis now.	We <u> PLAYED </u> tennis yesterday.
4. I <u> DRINK </u> juice every day.	I <u> AM DRINKING </u> juice now.	I drank juice yesterday.
5. He <u> TEACHES </u> every day.	He is teaching now.	He <u> TAUGHT </u> yesterday.
6. She <u> SWIMS </u> every day.	She <u> IS SWIMMING </u> now.	She swam yesterday.
7. Do you sleep late every day?	<u> ARE </u> you <u> SLEEPING </u> now?	<u> DID </u> you <u> SLEEP </u> late yesterday?
8. He <u> READS </u> the newspaper every day.	He is reading the newspaper now.	He <u> READ </u> the newspaper yesterday.
9. They <u> TRY </u> hard every day.	They <u> ARE TRYING </u> hard now.	They tried hard yesterday.
10. We eat dinner every day.	We <u> ARE EATING </u> dinner now.	We <u> ATE </u> dinner yesterday.
11. <u> DOES </u> he <u> TALK </u> on the phone every day?	Is he talking on the phone now?	<u> DID </u> he <u> TALK </u> on the phone yesterday?
