



PREPOSITIONS AND PREPOSITIONAL PHRASES

A preposition is a word used to show the relationship of a noun, pronoun, or noun equivalent to another word or word group in a sentence. A preposition usually refers to *position in time or space*.

Examples: The table was set **under** a tree.
The airplane flew **over** the crowd.

One word prepositions

Two- and three-word prepositions

Two- and three-word prepositions are used like one-word prepositions:

Examples: Put the salad fork **near** the dinner fork. (one-word preposition)
Put the salad fork **next to** the dinner fork. (two-word preposition)
