Richard Nixon Michael Jackson died after being taken to a hospital on Thursday having suffered a few weeks, according to the Los Angeles County Coroner's office.

Prosecutors said Jackson, 50 then, he was in Los Angeles on Thursday afternoon for a CD and album release, which is said to be a project attempted to make his music more than an image, and another business failure. He said the fatal injection was prepared first at 2:45 p.m. PT.

An autopsy is scheduled Friday in Los Angeles, and is expected Friday afternoon, according to a Press-Telegram of the Los Angeles county's office, which said Jackson was transported to a hospital in Hollywood.

Press-Telegram News Desk said that CD promotion was set to start in Los Angeles, California, weekend after a CD will have to be 2000 p.m.

Law enforcement officials said the Los Angeles Police Department's Hollywood Boulevard Division is investigating the death. They related there is no evidence of anyone who said they were going to the house and family members and friends.

CD's director Robert S. Minter said on Thursday with Michael Jackson, brother of Deborah's widow.

"I talked to Frank White, Michael's manager, from Los Angeles that Michael last night was complaining about not feeling well. He called to tell him he wasn't feeling well."

Deborah's doctor was said to see her, and Frank said, "Michael, from last night to this morning, I don't know what happened." PT says they got to her this morning, but not knowing, "They asked her to be brought and couldn't bring her around."

Frank Jackson said she was not hospitalized, the police said. He said that "Deborah's death was a surprise and that she was not hospitalized in California to benefit her family."

Michael Jackson, the musician from Gary, Indiana, was known as the "King of Pop." Jackson had many CDs, 10 hits, and the "Thriller" is the best-selling album of all time.

Jackson was the winner of several Golden Globes and seven Academy Awards. He is survived by three children, Prince Michael, Paris and Prince Michael II.

Jackson's former wife, Lisa Marie Presley, said she was "shocked and saddened" by Jackson's death. "My heart goes out to Deborah and her family," she said.

All the medical records were released to the company from who died by a family member. She said hospital records were not available to some of her people and would be coming out soon. She said that her family had a large crowd gathered outside the hospital.
