

Michael Jackson

Entertainer Michael Jackson died Saturday in a hospital in Beverly Hills after suffering cardiac arrest, according to his Los Angeles attorney, Christopher Darden.

Paramedics took Jackson, 52, from his home last August to the University of Southern California Medical Center, where a team of physicians attempted to resuscitate him for more than six hours, said Darden's spokesman, Michael. He said the legal singer was pronounced dead at 2:26 p.m. PT.

The singer's death was unexpected. Last year he received Police clearance, according to a statement of the City of Los Angeles' Office of the City Attorney, that no criminal wrongdoing had occurred during his 2001 performance at the Staples Center, now known as STAPLES Center, in Los Angeles.

Law enforcement officials said the Los Angeles Police Department had kept Michael Jackson's personal information confidential. They argued that it's important that they remain silent about his family members and friends.

CBS4 News' Robert S. Morris spoke to Darden with Michael Jackson's brother of Michael's death.

"I'm sorry to hear [about Michael], Morris," says Darden. "Please know that I'm very sorry for his passing. Please call me back if you need anything."

Michael Jackson's doctor says he saw him just four days ago. "Michael, you look right to me," he says. "I don't know what happened." When asked if he has been working, Dr. Michael says, "They worked from 10 to 10 tonight, and patient training has started."

"Michael Jackson paid the best cardiologist in the country to do his heart," he says. "Please tell [Darden] and [the] family that Michael is still fighting and fighting."

Michael Jackson's spokesman, Bruce Gagnon, in Atlanta, says he was at the "People's Vigil" Jackson held every Friday at his home, until the "Woolard" or Michael Jackson Foundation, all come.

Jackson was the victim of cardiomyopathy, which causes a weakened heart. His symptoms started about two years ago, and Prince Michael II.

Jackson's former wife, Lisa Marie Presley, says she "shouldn't exist" by Jackson's death. "My husband gave me his heart, his love and his beauty," she said.

On Wednesday, Jackson's body was taken to the Los Angeles County morgue, where it will be examined by pathologists. Those findings will be explained to agents of the coroner, medical examiner and attorney of the dying King of Pop.

Jackson's death was being investigated. The cause of "Michael" and "King of Pop" was not immediately known.

Clarified sources said the former judge issued an emergency order. The court is investigating Jackson's death in an attempt to find the truth, but recent people were gathered outside the gates.

Michael Jackson's death has been legal trouble since he became
