Counting Money

Coin designs are always changing. You cannot always depend on remembering the design to figure out what a coin is. Pay attention to the size of the coin to help you out. The back of the coin will tell you how much it is worth.

When counting coins, it is sometimes helpful to write the value above each coin. Then, do a running count of the total value below the coins. An example is below.
