

LESSON PLAN – Year Nine

Learning Objectives/National Curriculum Links

PSHE: 2f

English: En1 3a, 3b, 3c, 3d, 3e; En3 9b, 10, 11

What you will need

Enough risk assessment worksheets to distribute one to each individual for homework

Worksheet for each student

Activities

- 1. As a homework exercise, students should use a copy of the risk assessment worksheet from Year Eight to assess the risks involved in either a particular area of their home or a particular activity carried out in the home. When completed they should bring the work to class**
2. Divide the students into small groups and ask them to present their risk assessments to each other. Ask the group to elect one person to present their work to the whole class (15 mins)
3. Gather the class together and listen to one presentation from each group. For each presentation ask the class to suggest how some of the risks might be minimised (15 mins)
4. Ask individuals to complete an action plan addressing some of the areas of concern identified in their risk assessment. Caution them that they should begin by addressing the most serious areas of risk, as they would in real life, then go on to look at those risks that do not present as great a danger (20 mins)
5. Gather the class together and ask each individual to present the most serious risk identified on their risk assessment and how they proposed to minimise this risk on their action plan (10 mins)

Additional Activities

1. Students could complete another risk assessment and action plan focussing on the needs of a particular group, eg young children, the elderly, disabled individuals

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
