Plymouth	Separation from the Church of England Religious Persecution
Massachusetts Bay	Puritan Religious persecution
Pennsylvania	Quakers Religious Freedom
Georgia	Debtors Economic Freedom

Southern	Appalachian Mountains, Piedmont, Atlantic Coastal Plain, great harbors, rivers, humid climate	Large farms and plantations, cash crops, wood products, small farms, slavery	Plantations (slavery), mansions, indentured servants, free cities, free schools, Church of England	Counties
