

# Glossaries



Some books have a list of words called a **glossary** at the back. A **glossary** tells you what words mean, like a little dictionary. Read this glossary from a book about plants.

<b>flower</b>	a part of a plant where new seeds grow
<b>leaf</b>	a part of a plant that grows on the stem
<b>light</b>	something plants need to grow
<b>root</b>	the part of a plant in the soil
<b>seed</b>	can grow into a new plant
<b>sproutling</b>	a young plant
<b>soil</b>	the earth that plants grow in
<b>stem</b>	the main part of a plant
<b>water</b>	something plants need to grow
