- a. What were some of the **causes** of the dust storms that struck the Great Plains region of the U.S.?
 - b. Which states had areas that were damaged by dust storms?
 - c. Which states had areas of **severe** damage?
 - d. Approximately how many miles **long (north to south)** was the area damaged by dust storms?
 - e. According to the reading on page 337, how many **square miles** were damaged by the dust storms?
 - f. To what West Coast states did many of the migrants from the Dust Bowl move in hopes of finding a better life?
 - g. What were the major **highways** that people took to leave the Dust Bowl region?
 - h. Those who migrated west from Oklahoma were called "_____".
 - i. What kinds of **problems** do you think occurred with many people migrating West during this time?
 - j. What Southern city was the headquarters of the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA), a federal government program that brought electricity to the Tennessee River valley during the Great Depression?
 - k. Which major Midwestern and Eastern cities shown on the map might have had large numbers of unemployed seeking food, shelter, and jobs?
