

Story Elements

Genre:	The type of story or literary work.
Author:	Person who writes the storybook.
Setting:	Where and when a story takes place.
Main Characters:	The important people in the story.
Theme:	<p>The underlying or stated main idea of a story.</p> <p>*Often, the author implies the theme through the protagonist's thoughts and feelings. The theme can also be the message an author is trying to send.</p>
Conflict:	<p>The major problem in the story.</p> <p>Two categories of conflict:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. External—happens outside of the character, involves more than 1 person, can be observed. 2. Internal—happens inside of the character, involves only 1 person, can only be observed in the thoughts & feelings. <p>Three types of conflict:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Man vs. Nature (External) 2. Man vs. Self (Internal) 3. Man vs. Man (External or Internal)
Climax:	One large event that changed the outcome of the entire story.
Plot:	<p>The sequence of all events in a story.</p> <p>*The plot is usually what we summarize.</p>
Critique:	A reader's personal thoughts & opinions on the story or book. *Involves both "Likes" and "Dislikes".
