### **Exercise**

#### **The Universal Declaration of Human Rights**

During most of the 1940s there was a sense of optimism that many conditions in post-war Germany.

Some people, then, saw the need to protect the fundamental rights of man, especially concerned by the Nazi era, which violated Human Rights throughout Europe.

In 1948, the UN General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights - 50 documents now protect the rights of everyone across the world.

#### **Scope of Human**

- Individual human beings
- Society
- State
- International organisations

These are things that the UN believed that all people deserve individual, regardless of where they live.

Complaints, conflicts, disputes and disagreements are settled by considering the UN Declarations and principles behind rights issues. The UN also has a committee which settles these.

Other organisations, cultural, Amnesty International, monitor situations where Human Rights are not being maintained, and put pressure on governments to challenge problematic situations.
