

## GLUE WORDS

Conjunctions are words that join words or parts of sentences together. The three most common conjunctions are and, or, and but. Each one means something different.

...... And joins words or phrases that go together equally. Or gives you a choice. But introduces something that contrasts with something earlier in the sentence.
