

## GLUE WORDS

Conjunctions are words that join words or parts of sentences together. The three most common conjunctions are **and**, **or**, and **but**. Each one means something different.

**And** joins words or phrases that go together equally.

**Or** gives you a choice.

**But** introduces something that contrasts with something earlier in the sentence.
