

## ADJECTIVES & ADVERBS

### Comparison

good	better	best	badly	worse	worst
↓	↓	↓	↓	↓	↓
well	more well	best	poorly	more poorly	worst

**NOTE**  
 Some adjectives  
 forming comparatives  
 irregularly  
 good better best  
 bad worse worst

### DEGREE

How well he runs  
 How often he goes  
 How long he stays  
 How well he does

He runs **very** well  
 He goes **often**  
 He stays **long**  
 He does **very well**

### Adjectives or adverbs?

#### ADJECTIVES

**Before nouns:**  
 The **intelligent** child  
**After the verb "to be":**  
 He is **young**  
**After "has", "are", "was", "were", "am", "are", "was", "were":**  
 He **is** **happy**  
**The other words go:**  
 He **is** **running** **quickly**  
 He **is** **running** **very** **quickly**  
 He **is** **running** **quickly** **and** **is** **running** **slowly**

#### ADVERBS

**After verbs:**  
 He **is** **running** **quickly**  
 He **is** **running** **very** **quickly**  
**Before adjectives:**  
 He **is** **very** **happy**  
**Before other adverbs:**  
 He **is** **running** **very** **quickly**  
**Before a verb phrase:**  
 He **is** **running** **very** **quickly**

### DEGREE

**Adverb:** a word which shows something or someone is how, when, where or why.  
**Adjective:** a word which describes something or someone.  
**Adverb:** how (quickly) he runs. He runs **quickly**.  
**Adjective:** how (well) he does. He does **very well**.
