2. GENERAL SAFETY RULES FOR ALL EMPLOYEES

It is the responsibility of all employees to follow the following safety rules:

- Read and understand the safety procedures applicable to the job.
- In case of an emergency, remain calm and follow the instructions of your supervisor. Do not panic and do not attempt to handle the situation on your own.
- In case of an injury, immediately report the incident to your supervisor. Do not attempt to hide the injury or try to cover it up.
- Do not use any tools, equipment, or machinery unless you have been properly trained and authorized to do so.
- Do not drink or use alcohol or drugs while working. Do not use any equipment or machinery if you are impaired.
- When required, use all personal protective equipment (PPE) properly, including safety glasses, hard hats, gloves, and shoes.
- Safety equipment must be inspected, used, and maintained in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- Report any unsafe conditions, hazards, or equipment to your supervisor immediately. Do not attempt to fix equipment unless you are qualified to do so.
