The President of the United States of America and the First
Consul of the French Republic in the name of the French
People desiring to remove all cause of misunderstanding
relative to objects of discussion mentioned in the second
and fifth articles of the Convention of the ^{17th Vendémiaire 1793} ~~1793~~
relative to the rights claimed by the United States in virtue of
the Treaty concluded at Madrid the 27 of October 1795 between
The Catholic Majesty & the said United States & willing to
strengthen the union and friendship which at the time of
the said Convention was happily re-established between the two
nations have respectively named their Plenipotentiaries to wit
The President of the United States by and with the advice
and consent of the Senate of the said State: Robert R.
Livingston Minister Plenipotentiary of the United States
and James Monroe Minister Plenipotentiary and Extraordinary
Ambassador of the said State near the Government of the
French Republic; and the First Consul in the name
of the French people: Citizen Francois Barbé Marbois
Minister of the public treasury who after having respectively
exchanged their full powers have agreed to the following
articles
