

Noun-Adjective Agreement

When a noun is masculine, the adjective that describes it should also be masculine. If a noun is feminine, the noun that describes it should also be feminine.

Example: Camisa is feminine. Rojo is masculine. The color (the adjective) is what changes. La camisa roja.

Change the adjectives to match the noun.

If the adjective ends with "O" or "A" you can add an "S" to make it plural.

Example: Los zapatos negros.

- 5) Las blusas Amarillo _____

If the adjective ends with a consonant (such as "L" or "N" or "S") you don't have to add an "O" or an "A." It just stays the same. If you need to make it plural, you add "es" to the end.

Example: Pantalones azules.
