

Behavioral expectations – do's and don't's

Behavioral expectation	Examples	Non-examples
Compliance	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Follow the teacher's directions.• Do what the teacher asks after one request.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Don't talk back or argue with teacher.• Don't take too long to do what you're told.
Preparation	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Have books, pencils & paper with you when you enter the classroom.• Bring completed homework to class.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Don't forget your stuff.• Be ready for class.
Talking	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ask questions and make comments relevant to the topic only.• Use quiet voices when working with groups or independently.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Be polite and respectful to your peers.• No talking when the teacher is talking.
In class behavior	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Keep your hands and feet to yourself.• Leave your seat only with permission.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Do your best!• No cheating, lying or stealing.• No gum, candy or soda in class.
Being on time	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Be in your seat before the bell rings.• Be in class with paper and pen out by 8 a.m.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Don't be late
Transition behavior	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Remain in your seat while changing academic activities.• Line up quietly before walking to the next classroom.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Don't leave before the bell.• No backpacks, coats or hats in the classroom.
