UNDERMINE	32	7	erode the base or foundation of (a rock formation); weaken gradually or insidiously (7)
INNOVATION	31	4	a new method, idea, product, etc.
CONVENTIONAL	30	4	conforming to established practice or accepted standards; traditional; devoted to or bound by conventions to the point of artificiality; ceremonious; unimaginative
valid; validate	28	0	VALID: based on evidence or sound reasoning; having legal force VALIDATE: check or prove the validity of; make or declare legally valid
OBSCURE (adj. & verb)	26	2	adj.: not discovered or known about; not well known; not clearly expressed or easily understood; indistinct verb: conceal or make unclear
IRREFUTABLE; REFUTE	25	1	IRREFUTABLE: impossible to deny or disprove; incontrovertible (5) REFUTE: prove (a statement or the person advancing it) to be wrong
DISCERN	24	2	recognize or find out; distinguish with difficulty by sight or with the other senses
PROFOUND; PROFUNDIT	24	5	PROFOUND: very deep; marked by intellectual depth; deeply felt; thoroughgoing PROFUNDITY: great depth; abstruseness; intensity of feeling, understanding, ...
SUPERFICIAL	24	3	of or pertaining to the surface; apparent rather than actual; not thorough or deep; cursory (7); lacking depth of character or understanding
AMBIGUOUS	23	2	(of language) having two or more meanings; not clear, vague
DISTORT	23	7	pull or twist out of shape; give a misleading account of
FABRICATE	23	1	invent, typically with deceitful intent; construct or manufacture (an industrial product)
IN(DISCRIMINATE)	23	5	INDISCRIMINATE: done or acting at random or without careful judgment. DISCRIMINATE (verb): recognize a distinction
SPECULATE	23	7	form a theory or conjecture (9) without firm evidence; surmise (2)
COMPLACENT	22	2	smugly (4) pleased and self-satisfied, esp. uncritically or unwarrantedly (8)
SUPERFLUOUS	22	3	unnecessary, esp. through being more than enough
AMBIVALENT	21	1	having mixed feelings or contradictory ideas about something or someone
BELIE	21	7	fail to give a true idea of; show to be untrue or unjustified
CONTEND; CONTENTIOL	21	5	CONTEND: struggle to deal with (a difficulty); fight or argue; compete; assert CONTENTIOUS: causing or likely to cause disagreement or controversy
ERADICATE	21	4	remove or destroy completely; extirpate (1), get rid of
INNOCUOUS	21	5	not harmful or offensive
AESTHETIC; AESTHETE	20	4	AESTHETIC: concerned with beauty or the appreciation of beauty AESTHETE: a person who is appreciative of art or beauty
