The Special Immigrant Juvenile Status (SIJS) law permits undocumented children who have come under the jurisdiction of a juvenile court and meet other requirements to become lawful permanent residents.

## Under the federal statute the requirements for SIJS are:

The child <u>must be declared dependent</u> on a juvenile court, or the court must have <u>legally</u> committed the child to or <u>placed the child under the custody</u> of a state department or agency;

The child must be deemed eligible for long-term foster care; and

A judge or administrative authority must have determined that <u>return</u> to the previous home country is <u>not in the child's best interest</u>.

The judge should make clear that all of the above findings and determinations were made because of the neglect, abuse or abandonment of the child.
