Conjunctive Adverbs and Subordinating Conjunctions

To apply Six Apostle number four, you must understand the difference between conjunctive adverbs and subordinating conjunctions.

Conjunctive adverbs: (these tie the two ICs together)

However, consequently, moreover, besides, Therefore, accordingly furthermore, also, further, thus, then, nevertheless, hence, otherwise indeed, similarly, alternatively, yet (also used as a coordinating conjunction) first, second, finally, subsequently, meanwhile, generally, overall, next

Also, note that some prepositional phrases are often used in the same sense as conjunctive adverbs:

for example, in other words, in addition, on the contrary, in fact, for this reason, in conclusion

Subordinating Conjunctions:

although, than, after, since, because, unless, if, before, where, whereas

that, though, when, until, provided that, rather than, whether, even if
