American Alligator

This small animal builds a den, usually in a hillside or overbank in the cold alpine tundra or area of the north pole.

Diamondback
Rattlesnake

Very comfortable hiding under rocks, old logs, or along brooks, creeks, and streams, this little creature likes to stay wet.

Salamander

Adapted with a thick layer of fat and scale-like feathers for the frigid South Pole, this animal enjoys the cold ocean and icy terrain.

Emperor Penguin

Located in the North Atlantic Ocean along the coastline, this crustacean usually lives in the shallow waters of less than 50 meters. The rocky bottoms, covered in algae, make it easy for these creatures to hide.

Loosestar

Mainly found in Florida and Louisiana, this reptile spends its time in muddy swamps and marshes that house lots of prey.

Atlantic Puffin

This venomous reptile is found mostly in the hot states of Georgia and Florida in dry, sandy areas or around swamps and ponds. Although they avoid wet areas, they are good swimmers and
