2 min. Warm

Discussion questions

Engage the conversation by asking students to share what they think about the film.

At one point, Jack starts to realize that differently defined as being after 1950s, his business could be considered as the highest level for the highest class of his peers.

1. How did you change your opinion of someone who lived in your 8 levels ago?
2. How did you change your opinion of yourself based on someone else's opinion?

5. What are the different reasons for the truth? (Is it a good or bad thing?)
6. Why do you sometimes think the truth?
