Curriculum Objectives

The ESL IPG for 8th grade has two main objectives. In an effort to increase student success, the district is aligning the ESL curriculum with the Language Arts IPG. Therefore the first objective of the 8th grade ESL IPG is to merge Languages Arts essential knowledge and skills, or TEKS, with Second Language Acquisition TEKS. By doing this, the district is looking to ease the transition of English Language Learners (ELLs) into the mainstream as well as prepare them for statewide assessments.

The second objective of this curriculum is to provide teachers with a user-friendly document to guide them in their teaching. While aligned with the TEKS, it was written with the progression of Visions C, the adopted text for Middle School ESL in Austin ISD, in mind. The curriculum includes content, student work products and assessments from Visions C that best reflect the TEKS assessed on the TAKS for Language Arts along with content and approaches for second language instruction.

The 8th grade ESL IPG incorporates TEKS from the 8th grade Language Arts IPG. However, the ESL IPG is intended to be used with Advanced ELLs, regardless of their grade level. Please take this into account when scheduling students.
