

Stages

- > stages of writing to be performed by students previous to discussion of writer's code
 - > it is usually performed for an audience
 - > it is divided into several acts
 - > dramatic scenes: 3 acts
 - > scenes: 3 acts usually 3 scenes each
 - > act can be divided into several scenes
 - > dramatic scene: act of 15-20 minutes is change of place or time or time
 - > normally the characters get together unless and give the dialogue
 - > stage directions are used to describe
 - > appearance of the characters
 - > movement of the characters
 - > setting, time of place
 - > sound and lighting
- and showing to other reader to imagine the movement scene

Some Dramatic Rules

- 1) A drama needs only to be read.

- 2) There are usually several scenes.

- 3) A dramatic scene usually consists of one act.

- 4) A scene can be divided into several acts.

- 5) It is usual to change of time or place in a scene.

- 6) A drama can be performed in many ways.

- 7) The dialogue helps to show the action scene to the reader.

- 8) The stage directions often include setting, lighting, and sound.
