2.	A Fast-food restaurants are changing, now they offer healthier food choices.
	B Fast-food restaurants are changing. Now they offer healthier food choices.
	Answer A is incorrect. There are two independent clauses.
	Answer B is correct.
3.	A Anna wants to teach children, so she will become a first grade teacher.
	B Anna wants to teach children she will become a first grade teacher.
	Answer A is correct. (If you thought this sentence had a comma splice, remember that you can join two sentences with a comma and a coordinating conjunction.)
	Answer B is incorrect. There are two independent clauses.
4.	A This coffee is several hours old. It tastes terrible.
	B This coffee is several hours old, it tastes terrible.
	Answer A correct.
	Answer B is incorrect. There are two independent clauses.
