- 7. The right to be involved in decision-making about his/her educational programs.**
- 8. The right to express divergent points of view.**
- 9. The right to be unique and different in a society that values conformity and equality.**
- 10. The right to have time for thinking and dreaming.**
- 11. The right to have support and stimulation from significant adults.**
