They are also required to ensure that none of the grantee's principals, subrecipients, or their third party contractors and subcontractors are debarred, suspended, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in federally-assisted transactions. Also, subrecipients must obtain these certifications for any third party contract over \$100,000. This certification must be included in the solicitation process (the Request for Proposal) as well as in any final agreement with contractors and subcontractors.  a.)
