

Watercolor Pencil Techniques Worksheet

VALUE SCALE

In the set of 5 boxes below, apply the watercolor pencil to each line so that it progressively gets darker from the first to the last line. The harder you press, the darker the color. Apply clean water over each line individually, making sure to stay within the box.



GRADED BLEND (Gradient)

In the box below, apply the watercolor pencil so that it progressively gets darker from the one side of the box to the other. Apply clean water over the box, making sure the watercolor is the lightest concentration, gradually over the other side.



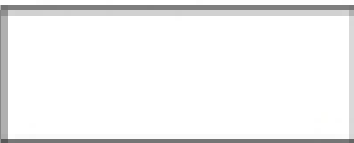
BLENDING COLORS

In the two boxes, apply 2 different colors of watercolor pencil half with one color & half with the other color overlapping & blending them in the middle of the box. Apply clean water starting in the first color overlapping about halfway on your hand toward the second color & the end of the box. Do



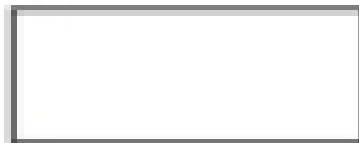
HARD EDGE

In the box below, apply 2 different colors of watercolor pencil half with one color & half with the other color overlapping, but firmly blending. Apply clean water over the first color & 2/3 of 2/3. Then press over the second color with the edge along the first color.



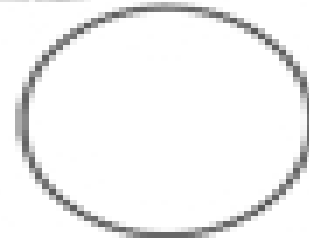
SOFT EDGE

In the box below, apply 2 different colors of watercolor pencil half with one color & half with the other color slightly overlapping, apply clean water over the first color & come in a soft wet pressure over the second color the 2 colors should blend together slightly.



FLAT WASH

In the box above, apply the watercolor pencil so that it is an even color across the box. Starting at the top, apply clean water over the box. Overlapping your brush strokes slightly helps to even out the wash.



CRACKED BLEND

In the circle above, apply the watercolor pencil so that it is a gradient of colors creating the illusion of a sphere. Apply clean water over the circle, making sure to concentrate the clean water toward the center of the sphere. Then in the lightest area add some paint very into the

WET PAPER

By wetting your paper with your paint brush and drawing over the wet area.
