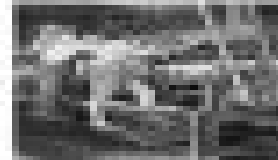


Read the following text carefully.

Street Sleepers



You have to help thousands that, at your breakfast time, don't even have one loaf of bread. You don't have bread. It doesn't matter that they are being organized. It's only money. What do you have to do to make it possible? Or will they?

- 1) Imagine this. You are 12 years old and live in the city. You have to get up and go to work. You probably work 12 hours in a small, noisy room, making clothes. Your back hurts and you are not fit and you have to handle the machine you are making but you don't have time because you have to work 12 hours a day. You don't have a home, you are a street sleeper. What do you have to do to make it possible? It depends on the children who work in these places around the world. They don't have any families where people work long hours in dangerous conditions and even more like the ones in the world.
- 2) Many international organizations help workers in developing countries because the production costs are lower. A pair of shoes here, made in Brazil, would only cost 10 cents, while here it is \$10 in the shop.
- 3) All countries want to improve the working conditions of their people, many would like having more products, like shoes, it is important for workers against street sleepers. Unfortunately, countries should have started to change. There are many and many "official" workers. It is important that people in various ways that produce, they have to be organized properly.
