9th Grade English Lesson Plans

Objective

The student will be able to identify the rules of English class, state the significance of the syllabus, and complete a questionnaire. The student will also be able to describe a reaction assignment, state the topic, and know the dates when reactions are due.

Procedure

- 1. Hand out class rules and class syllabus.
- 2. Go over rules, points to remember, class syllabus, and grading system.
- 3. Hand out questionnaire and have students complete it.
- 4. Collect the questionnaire.
- 5. Describe a reaction as a three to five paragraph, informal, expository essay.
- 6. Explain the topic: Choose one piece of literature that we have read in the last few weeks and simply react to it. Does the piece of literature spark a certain feeling in you? Does it remind you of an embarrassing moment? A family member? A tragedy?
- 7. Give an example of a reaction topic in reference to today's homework assignment.
- 8. Explain the importance of a reaction NOT being a summary.
- 9. Explain that they may get further reaction ideas from sections of the book entitled "Connect to Your Life," "Connect to the Literature," and "What do you think?"
- 10. Explain that, regardless of whether I remind them or not, a reaction is due every Friday that we have class.
