

**10<sup>th</sup> Grade Honors English --Dr. Suzanne Lustie**

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Students will engage in a wide variety of reading and writing activities as they seek to move to an advanced level of proficiency as measured by Douglas County reading and writing standards. English Honors is seen as a very important part of the vertical team alignment preparing students to take Advanced Placement Language and Composition as a Junior and Advanced Placement Literature and Composition as a Senior. For many students, success in the honors programs and the AP program gives them the self-confidence and preparation necessary to accomplish college-level work. Thus, there is a higher level of expectation in this class than in a regular English class. This may not be in the amount of homework assigned but rather in the expectation of the level of intellectual curiosity, rigor and commitment.

**Please note:** All written assignments done outside of class must be typed, double spaced or 1.5 spaced (*with some exceptions, e.g., in class journal work*)

**Student's Right to Read**

Please note: I believe in the National Council of Teachers of English "Student's Right to Read" policy which encourages students to make intelligent decisions for appropriate reading. Students who do not wish to read a selection for reasons of personal values, religious beliefs or other significant objections may at any time, with the teacher's guidance, select an alternative work comparable in difficulty and subject matter. However, if you want alternative titles there needs to be a connection with what we are doing in class. Know that you may need to have an independent study unit in the library. Also know that this class is pre-AP so the list of works used on the AP test should be consulted if an alternate is needed.

**Independent Reading**

We will do some reporting on books read outside of class but I can't encourage you enough to read widely on your own. Don't wait to only read what you are assigned in class. Literature serves a wide variety of purposes. I have a huge selection of books in the room for you to use for your recreational reading if you wish. I would encourage you to sample them, and talk to me about them. Just be sure these books eventually come back to my room.
