Benjamin Harrison (August 20, 1833 – March 23, 1901) was the 23rd President of the United States. Benjamin Harrison was elected by the Electoral College and not by popular vote. His grandfather was the 9th President. Harrison signed the Sherman Anti-Trust Act, which was aimed at preventing big businesses from creating monopolies. Harrison also focused on foreign policy. He led the first Pan-American Conference. Harrison was not elected a second term.
