

Worksheet 1: Identifying Theme in 1984

1984 is a political novel written with the purpose of warning readers in the West of the dangers of totalitarian government. Let's examine the book's themes and motifs.

Theme: Fundamental and often universal ideas explored in literary works. You extract theme by interpreting the characters, action, and setting that make up the story.
Motif: Recurring structures, contrasts, and literary devices that can help to develop and inform the text's major themes.

Activity: Complete the chart below with a partner. Site the pages on which you find your examples, analyze each example, and try to connect the example to a modern example.

Theme/Motif	Example	Analysis (analyze how it develops)	Modern Example
Control of Information (Theme)	"Contagious means not thinking--not having to think."	Through the elimination of opposing ideas and dissenting thoughts, Big Brother transforms the Party's thoughts to aligning into a mindless state incapable of thought.	Control continues to control information, differences between right and left, conservative and liberal, between Police violence, like KKK, remains behind people's backs for motives.
