Was a social worker who founded one of the most famous settlement houses in America. She received the Nobel Peace Prize in 1931 for her social work.

Giving her name to an era, ruled the United Kingdom for 63 years. Her reign was the longest of any British monarch, with the sun never set.

Was an American writer, most famous for her African-American poems and series of autobiographies.

Honored as Saint Teresa, she devoted her life to the poor and the helpless. In 1979, she won the Nobel Prize for her humanitarian work.

Considered an iconic figure of the literary world, an English novelist. Her works reflect the lives of middle-class English people.

An English primatologist and anthropologist. She researched chimpanzees in Africa, used tools, and studied their social behavior.

Popularly known as "The Lady with the Lamp," she was an English nurse and the founder of modern nursing.
