This movement was led by people who fought for fair working conditions for all laborers, or workers, in our country.

Years ago many workers faced harsh conditions, working long days with very little pay. Even young children worked in dangerous factories and coal mines. The workers decided to fight for their rights. They formed groups called labor unions who demanded better working conditions and higher pay. In 1894 Congress voted to declare Labor Day a national holiday to recognize the importance of workers' rights. Today people often gather for Labor Day parades and parties to celebrate this holiday which holds a special meaning to workers throughout our country.
