Sacagawea was a Native American woman from the Lemhi Shoshone tribe. She helped with the Lewis and Clark Expedition, which took place from 1804 to 1806.

Only a teenager, Sacagawea helped explorers Meriwether Lewis and William Clark and their team cross western parts of the United States that were gained in the Louisiana Purchase. The men explored lands all the way to the Pacific Ocean. Sacagawea traveled thousands of miles with the explorers, as she helped them learn about the land and find their way across it.

Today, many statues and memorials help people remember Sacagawea. She has also been on a U.S. postage stamp and a U.S. dollar coin.
